YARN

MYK PÅFUGL 73% mohair, 22% wool, 5% polyamide, 50 grams = 90 metres

SIZES

XXS (XS) S (M) L (XL) XXL (XXXL)

NOTE! See GARMENT MEASUREMENTS to find the right size

GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

Chest measurements approx. 86 (90) 98 (106) 114 (122) 134 (142) cm

Full length approx. 53 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm Sleeve-length approx. 49 cm or your desired length

YARN AMOUNTS

5 (5) 5 (6) 7 (8) 9 (10) balls

COLOUR

Bright green 7948

SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZE

7 and 9 mm long circular needles9 mm short circular needles7 mm douple pointed needles (DPNs)

KNITTING TENSION

10 sts with stocking st on 9 mm needles = 10 cm

Check your knitting tension by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm; if you have more sts than suggested change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts, change to a smaller needle size.

FIND THE RIGHT SIZE

- 1. Measure a garment that fits you.
- 2. Compare the measurements with the pattern.
- 3. Choose your size from the width of the body.
- 4. Body and sleeves can be worked longer or shorter as needed.

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit, P = purl, st. = stitch, r = row

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BODY


Cast on 86 (90) 98 (106) 114 (122) 134 (142) sts with 7 mm needles. Work rib in the round (K1, P1) for 7 cm. Insert a marker in each side with 43 (45) 49 (53) 57 (61) 67 (71) sts on both the front and back pieces. Change to 9 mm needles and work stocking st. When the piece measures 35 (35) 36 (37) 38 (39) 40 (42) cm divide on each side and finish the front and back pieces separately.

BACK PIECE

= 43 (45) 49 (53) 57 (61) 67 (71) sts.

Continue working stocking st back and forth until the piece measures 53 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm.

Loosely cast off. Insert a marker round the middle 19 (19) 21 (21) 23 (23) 23 (25) sts = neck with 12 (13) 14 (16) 17 (19) 22 (23) shoulder sts on each side.



FRONT PIECE

= 43 (45) 49 (53) 57 (61) 67 (71) sts.

Continue working stocking st back and forth until the piece measures 36 (36) 37 (38) 39 (40) 41 (43) cm.

At the same time, on the last row from the right side, cast off the middle st for the V-neck and finish each shoulder separately.

RIGHT SIDE

= 21 (22) 24 (26) 28 (30) 33 (35) sts.

Row 1: (= wrong side) P all stitches.

Row 2: Slip 1 st (= edge st), slip 1 st knitwise, repeat, place the 2 sts back on left needle and K them together through the back loops, K to end of row.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until there are 12 (13) 14 (16) 17 (19) 22 (23) shoulder sts left.

Continue working without further decreases until the piece measures 53 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm. Loosely cast off.

LEFT SIDE

= 21 (22) 24 (26) 28 (30) 33 (35) sts.

Row 1: (= wrong side) Slip 1 st purlwise, P to end of row.

Row 2: K until there are 3 sts left, K2 together, K1.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until there are 12 (13) 14 (16) 17 (19) 22 (23) shoulder sts left.

Continue working without further decreases until the piece measures 53 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm.

Loosely cast off.

SLEEVES

Loosely cast on 22 (22) 24 (24) 26 (26) 28 (28) sts with 7 mm needles and work 8 cm rib with K1, P1.

Change to 9 mm needles and work stocking st. **At the same time** on round 1, increase 14 sts evenly spaced = 36 (36) 38 (38) 40 (40) 42 (42) sts. Increase by knitting the strand between 2 sts twisted.

Insert a marker around 2 sts mid-under the sleeve.

When the sleeve measures 13 cm, increase 1 st on each side of the marker. **NOTE!** Not applicable for size XXS.

Repeat these increases every 13 cm 0 (0) 0 (1) (1) 2 (2) 2 more times = 36 (38) 40 (42) 44 (46) 48 (48) sts.


Work until the sleeve measures 49 cm or to your desired length.


Leave the stitches on the needle.


Work one more sleeve in the same way.

ASSEMBLY

Graft the shoulder sts together. Sew in the sleeves.







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
