## SHORT PHASIAN CARDIGAN

## DESIGN

Mari Kalberg Skjæveland

## YARN

MYK PÅFUGL 73\% mohair, 22\% wool, 5\% polyamide, 50 grams = approx. 90 metres

## SIZES

XXS-XS (S-M) L-XL (XXL-XXXL)
NOTE! See GARMENT MEASUREMENTS and find the right size

## GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

Chest size approx. 90 (106) 124 (140) cm
Full length approx. 46 (49) 52 (56) cm
Sleeve-length approx. 49 cm or to desired length)

## YARN AMOUNTS

Colour 1: 2 (3) 3 (3) balls
Colour 2: 2 balls in all sizes
Colour 3: 3 (3) 4 (4) balls
Colour 4: 2 (2) 3 (3) balls

## COLOURS

Colour 1: Light yellow 7901
Colour 2: White 0010
Colour 3: Pink 4612
Colour 4: Mint green 7949

## SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZE

Long and short circular needles and DPN sizes
10 mm and 12 mm

## KNITTING TENSION

8 sts stocking st with double strand and needle size $12 \mathrm{~mm}=10 \mathrm{~cm}$

Check your knitting tension by working a swatch. Count the number of sts per 10 cm ; if you have more sts than suggested change to a larger needle size. If you have less sts, change to a smaller needle size.

## FIND THE RIGHT SIZE

1. Measure a garment that fits you
2. Compare the measurements with the pattern.
3. Choose your size from the width of the body,
4. Length of body and sleeves; you can work them longer or shorter if you wish.

## The whole pieced is worked with double strand.

## FRONT AND BACK PIECES

Cast on 83 (99) 115 (131) 3 sts with colour 3 and needle size 10 mm . Work 6 cm rib and back and forth as follows:
Wrong side: 1 edge-st,P1 twisted, *K1, P1 twisted*, repeat from *-*, finish with 1 edge-st.
Right side: 1 edge-st,K1 twisted, *P1, K1 twisted*, repeat from *-*, finish with 1 edge-st.
NOTE! Tighten the first and last sts well.
Change to needle size 12 mm . Continue back and forth with stocking st and pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{A}$ with 1 edgest on each side.
At the same time, on row 1, decrease 9 (12) 14 (17) sts evenly spaced = 74 (87) 101 (114) sts. Insert a marker in each side with 19 (22) 26 (29) sts on front piece and 36 (43) 49 (56) sts on back piece.
When diagram $\mathbf{A}$ is finished the piece measures approx. 27 (29) 31 (33) cm. Divide the piece at each side-marker and finish each piece separately.

## BACK PIECE

= 36 (43) 49 (56) sts.
Work stocking stitch back and forth with colour 2. Work until the piece measures 29 (31) 33 (35) cm. Change to colour 1, and continue stocking st until the piece measures 46 (49) 52 (56) cm .

Cast off loosely as follows: *K2 twisted together, place st back on left needle*, repeat from *_* to end of round.

## RIGHT FRONT PIECE

= 19 (22) 26 (29) sts.
Work back and forth with stocking st and pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{B}$ and 1 edge-st at beginning of row.
At the same time, on row 1, decrease for V-neck from right side as follows: 1 edge st, K1, K2 twisted together, work to end of row. Repeat the decrease every 2 nd row a total of $5(5) 7(7)$ times $=14$ (17) 19 (22) shoulder-sts. Work until the piece measures 46 (49) 52 (56) cm. Cast off.

## LEFT FRONT PIECE

Work in the same way as the right front piece, but in reverse. Decrease for $V$-neck from right side as follows:
Work until there are 4 sts left, K2 together, K1, 1 edge-st.

## SLEEVES

Cast on 16 (18) 20 (22) 3 sts with colour 3 and needle size 10 mm . Work 6 cm rib in the round with K 1 twisted, P1. Change to needle size 12 mm and continue stocking st and pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{C}$. At the same time, on row 1 increase 1 (14) 14 (14) 14 sts evenly spaced $=30$ (32) 34 (36) sts. When diagram $\mathbf{C}$ is finished, the sleeve measures approx. 49 cm . Loosely cast off and work one more sleeve.

## ASSEMBLY

Sew the shoulder seams. Sew in the sleeves.
