


FLEUR JUMPER

FLEUR JUMPER

DESIGN

Brit Frafjord Ørstavik

YARN

TYNN KIDSILK ERLE 53 % mohair, 34 % silk, 13 % wool, 25 grams = approx. 287.5 metres

Alternative yarn: 1 strand of KIDSILK ERLE

SIZES

S (M) L (XL) XXL

NOTE! See MEASUREMENTS to find your size

MEASUREMENTS

Upper body approx. 96 (102) 109 (120) 131 cm Full length approx. 58 (60) 62 (64) 66 cm Sleeves approx. 48 cm or to desired length

YARN REQUIREMENTS

Colour 1 5 (5) 6 (6) 7 balls Colour 2 5 (5) 6 (6) 7 balls

COLOURS

Colour 1 Salmon Pink 4004 Colour 2 Copper 4007

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

3 mm and 3.5 mm long circular needles 3 mm short circular needles

GAUGE

22 sts of stocking st on 3.5 mm needles = 10 cm 23 sts of double moss st on 3.5 mm needles = 10 cm

Check your gauge by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm. If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

FIND YOUR SIZE

- 1. Measure a knitted garment that fits you.
- 2. Compare your measurements with those in the pattern.
- 3. Select your size based on the upper body measurements.
- 4. Body and sleeves may be worked longer or shorter as desired.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit, p = purl, st = stitch, R = round/row,
 DPN = double pointed needles, k2tog = knit 2 together,
 m = marker, PM = place marker, tbl = through back loop,
 RS/WS = right/wrong side





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DOUBLE MOSS STITCH

R1: *K2, P2*, repeat from *-* to end of R.

R2: K through K sts and P through P sts.

R3: *P2, K2*, repeat from *-* to end of R.

R4: P through P sts and K through K sts. Repeat R 1–4.

BODY

Using 3 mm circular needles and 1 strand of each colour, cast on 196 (212) 228 (252) 276 sts and work twisted rib in the round for 7 cm (K2 tbl, P2).

Change to 3.5 mm needles and work stocking st. PM around 2 sts in each side (=m sts), with 98 (106) 114 (126) 138 sts for the front and back pieces.

When the piece measures 14 cm, increase 1 st on each side of m sts by working the strand between 2 sts as K tbl = 4 sts increased.

Repeat the increases every 8 8 8.5 9 9.5 cm a total of 5 times = 216 (232) 248 (272) 296 sts. **NOTE!** Increases continue after you've divided the front and back pieces.

Work until the piece measures 36 (37) 38 (39) 40 cm. Divide the piece between the m sts in each side and work the front and back pieces separately.

BACK PIECE

Continue with stocking st, working flat, until the piece measures 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 cm = 108 (116) 124 (136) 148 sts. **NOTE!** The side increases continue as before, inside first st. Cast off for diagonal shoulders at beginning of each R on each side: 4,4,4,4,4,5 (4,5,5,5,5,5) 5,5,5,6,6 (6,6,6,6,7) 7.7.7.7.8 sts.

At the same time, when the piece measures 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm, cast off the middle 54 (54) 56 (58) 58 sts for the neckline and finish each side separately.

Continue casting off for the neckline every 2nd row, 1,1 st, **while also** continuing with the diagonal shoulder cast-offs. Work the other side in the same way, but in reverse.

FRONT PIECE

Work in the same way as back piece, including the diagonal shoulder cast-offs. **At the same time**, when the piece measures 52 (54) 56 (58) 60 cm, cast off the middle 38 (38) 40 (42) 42 sts for the neckline. Continue casting off for the neckline every 2nd R: 3,2,2,1,1,1 sts.

Work the other side in the same way, but in reverse.

SLEEVES

Using 3 mm needles and 1 strand of each colour, cast on 40 (44) 44 (48) 48 sts and work a rib flat for 14 cm as follows:

R1: (= WS) K1 (edge st), P2 tbl, *K2, P2 tbl*, repeat from *-*, K1 (edge st).

R2: K1 (edge st), K2 tbl, *P2, K2 tbl*, repeat from *-*, K1 (edge st).

Repeat R 1 and 2. Finish with 1 R from RS.

On the next R, increase as follows: Work as before, but make a Y/O between every st = 79 (87) 87 (95) 95 sts.

Change to 3.5 mm needles and work 1 R stocking st.

The Y/Os from the previous R are K tbl. At the same time increase 19 (17) 21 (19) 23 sts using Y/O = 98 (104) 108 (114) 118 sts. Keep working moss st, the Y/Os are either K tbl or P tbl depending on what fits the moss st.

Work until the piece measures approx. 48 cm, finishing with 1 WS R. Cast off using K sts, **while at the same time** working a pleat across the 24 middle sts as follows:

Place 4 sts on cable needle 1, place 4 sts on cable needle 2. Fold cable needle 2 behind cable needle 1 (WS to WS), fold main needle behind cable needle 2 (RS to RS).

K tog 1 st from each of the 3 needles = 1 st, **at the same time** as casting off.

Place 4 sts on cable needle 1, place 4 sts on cable needle 2, fold cable needle 2 in front of cable needle 1 (RS to RS), fold main needle in front of cable needle 2 (WS to WS). K tog 1 st from each of the 3 needles = 1 st, **at the same time** as casting off. **NOTE!** Tighten working yarn well when working $\frac{3}{2}$ pleat sts = 1 st. Work one more sleeve in the same way.



ASSEMBLY

Join the shoulder seams. Join the sleeve seams using mattress st. Join sleeves to body, make sure middle of sleeve pleat matches the shoulder seam.

NECKLINE

Using 3 mm circular needles and 1 strand of each colour, pick up 1 st through each st/R around the neckline but skip every 4th st/R. St count must be divisible by 4.

Work rib in the round (K2 tbl, P2) for 7 cm.

Cast off loosely. Fold the neck double to the inside and sew down with loose stitches.


EMBROIDERY

Use 2 strands of each colour. Embroider however many flowers you want, randomly placed across the yoke, using mille fleur sts. The flowers should be around 5, 6.5, and 8 cm across. Make 3–4 French knots at the centre of each flower.




FRENCH KNOTS


Insert the needle from behind where you want to place the knot. Wind the thread around the needle three or four times and hold the thread down to the fabric, while the needle is brought back through the fabric near where the first stitch was made.













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
