DESIGN

YARN

FAERYTALE 100 % finest alpaca, 50 grams = approx. 175 metres

SIZES

XS/S (M/L) XL/XXL

MEASUREMENTS

Upper body approx. 96 (102) 114 cm Full length approx. 56 (58) 60 cm Sleeve-length approx. 47 (49) 51 cm

YARN REQUIREMENTS

Black 719 5 (5) 5 balls Off-White 701 4 (4) 5 balls

COLOUR KEY

Colour 1 Two strands black

Colour 2 Two strands off-white

Colour 3 1 strand black and 1 strand off-white held together

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

8 mm long and short circular needles

GAUGE

13 sts stocking st with yarn held double on 8 mm needles = 10 cm

Check your gauge by working a swatch. Count the number of sts per 10 cm. If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

FIND YOUR SIZE

- 1. Measure a knitted garment that fits you.
- 2. Compare your measurements with those in the pattern.
- 3. Select a size based on the upper body measurements.
- 4. Body and sleeves may be worked longer or shorter as needed.


ABBREVIATIONS


k = knit, p = purl, st = stitch, R = round/row(s),
DPN = double pointed needles, K2 tog = knit 2 together,
m1 = make one (make a new st), RS/WS = right/wrong side

 $\bf X$ x 12 sts colour 2, 12 sts colour 3 x, repeat from x to x until square measures 9 cm

x 12 sts colour 3, 12 sts colour 1 x, repeat from x to x until square measures 10 cm \mathbf{X} .

Repeat from X to X. Twist yarns around one another at the transitions.

When working with colour 1 and colour 2 we recommend using the yarn end from inside the ball and the yarn end from outside the ball at the same time. When working with colour 3 we recommend making a ball with the two yarns before knitting.

FRONT PIECE

Using 8 mm needles, cast on 64 (68) 76 sts with colour 1. Work a rib (K2, P2) flat for 2 R. Continue working square pattern: Count outwards from the middle and work the 12 middle sts in colour 2. Working flat, continue with stocking st and square pattern, until the piece measures 37 (38) 39 cm. Cast off 4 sts on each side for the armholes = 56 (60) 68 sts. Work until the piece measures 51 (53) 55 cm. Cast off the middle 10 (12) 14 sts for the neckline. Finish each side separately.

Right-hand side: Cast off for neckline every 2nd R: 3, 2, 1, 1 sts (same for all sizes) = 16 (17) 20 sts. Work until the piece measures 56 (58) 60 cm, cast off. Work the left-hand side in the same way but in reverse.



BACK PIECE

Using 8 mm needles, cast on 64 (68) 76 sts with colour 1. Work a rib (K2, P2) flat for 2 R. Continue working square pattern: Count outwards from the middle and work the 12 middle sts in colour 2. Working flat, continue with stocking st and square pattern, until the piece measures 37 (38) 39 cm. Cast off 4 sts on each side for the armholes. Work until the piece measures 56 (58) 60 cm, cast off.

SLEEVES

Using 8 mm needles, cast on 20 (22) 24 sts with colour 1. Work a rib (K2, P2) flat for 2 R. Continue working square pattern: Count outwards from the middle and work the 12 middle sts in colour 2. M1 on each side every 3 (3) 3 cm until you have 52 (54) 56 sts on a R. Work square pattern as on the body. Work until the sleeve measures 47 (49) 51 cm. Continue working square pattern flat for 3 cm with no increases. Cast off.

Work the other sleeve in the same way.

ASSEMBLY

Graft the shoulder seams together. Sew in the sleeves. Join underarm and sleeve seams.

NECKLINE

Pick up approx. 16 sts per 10 cm with colour 1 on 8 mm needles around the neckline. St count must be divisible by 4. Work rib (K2, P2) in the round for 2 R. Cast off with K and P sts.
