YARN

BABY ULL 100 % superwash merino,
50 grams = approx. 165 metres

Alternative yarn: LILLE LERKE, SOFT MERINO

SIZE

One-size (adult)

MEASUREMENTS

Circumference approx. 47 cm

YARN REQUIREMENTS

3 balls

COLOUR

Light Lavender 8532

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

2.5 mm short circular needles and DPNs

GAUGE

28 sts rib on 2.5 mm needles (lightly stretched) = 10 cm

Check your gauge by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm. If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit, p = purl, st = stitch, R = round/row,
DPN = double pointed needles, k2tog = knit 2 together,
m = marker, tbl = through back loop,
RS/WS = right/wrong side

Cast on 132 sts on 2.5 mm needles.

Work a rib in the round (K1, P1) for 44 cm.

Place 3 markers as follows: PM around 3 sts, of which the 1st and the last must be P sts, and with 41 sts between each m st.

Decrease by working until 2 sts before each m, K2tog, work the m sts as P1, K1, P1, slip the next stitch knit-wise, slip 1 more st knit-wise, move the 2 slipped sts back onto your left needle, K2tog tbl = 126 sts.

Repeat the decreases on every other R, 2 more times = 114 sts.

Decrease by working until 3 sts before each m, K3tog, work the m sts as P1, K1, P1, slip the next stitch knit-wise, slip 2 more sts knit-wise, move the 3 slipped sts back onto your left needle, K3tog tbl = 102 sts. Repeat the decreases every other round until there are 18 sts remaining.

Cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining sts.

ASSEMBLY

Fold up the bottom 14 cm of the fabric to the RS, sew down with loose stitches.

Then fold up another 10 cm.
