RUSLE BABY SOCKS & COLLAR

DESIGN

House of Yarn

YARN

SOFT MERINO 100 % extra fine merino wool, 50 grams = approx. 187 metres

Alternative yarns: BABY ULL, LILLE LERKE

SIZES

Socks 44 (50–56) 62–68 (74) 80 Collar 50–62 (68–74) 80

YARN REQUIREMENTS

1 ball in all sizes

COLOUR Sand 3006

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

2.5 mm and 3 mm DPNs3 mm circular needles2.5 mm crochet hook

ACCESSORIES

1 button

GAUGE 28 sts with stocking st on 3 mm needles = 10 cm

Check your gauge by working a swatch. Count the number of sts per 10 cm. If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit, p = purl, DPN = double pointed needles, st = stitch,
R = round/row, k2tog = knit 2 together, m = marker,
PM = place marker, tbl = through back loop,
RS/WS = right side/wrong side, Y/O = yarn over,
ss = slip stitch, ch st = chain stitch

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Baby sizes in centilongs correspond to age in months:

- 44 = premature
- 50-56 = 0-1 month
- 62 = 3 months
- 68 = 6 months
- 74 = 9 months
- 80 = 12 months

SOCKS

Cast on 32 (36) 36 (40) 40 sts on 2.5 mm DPNs. Work 5 (6.5) 7 (7.5) 8 cm rib in the round (K2, P2). Change to 3 mm needles. Work 2 (2) 2 (3) 3 R of stocking st,

while at the same time decreasing 2 (4) 2 (4) 2 sts evenly spaced on R 1 = 30 (32) 34 (36) 38 sts.

Heel: Work 2 (2.5) 3 (3) 3.5 cm stocking st flat across the first 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 sts on the R. Finish with a RS R. **NOTE!** For a neat edge, tighten the first st well on each R.

PM in the middle of the heel. (The m is placed around the middle st in sizes 44, 62-68 and 80, and between the 2 middle sts in the other sizes.)

Decrease as follows:

P to 1 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts after marker, P2 tog tbl, turn. Slip 1 st purlwise with working yarn on WS, K to 1 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts after marker, K2 tog, turn.

Slip 1 st purlwise with working yarn on WS, P to 1 st before the "hole", P2 tog tbl, turn.

Repeat the decreases until all sts outside the «hole» have been worked.

Knit up 8 (10) 12 (12) 14 sts on each side of heel and continue in the round with stocking st.

PM on each side of the 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 instep sts = side m. Decrease as follows: K2 tog before the first side m. After the second side m slip 1 st knitwise, K1 and pass the slipped stitch over = 2 sts decreased (no decreases on the instep).

Repeat the decreases on every R until there are 30 (32)

34 (36) 38 sts left. Work until the foot measures 6 (6.5) 7.5(9) 10 cm from the marker on the heel.

Toe decreases: K2 tog, K1 before each side m, and K1, K2 tog tbl after each side m = 4 sts decreased. Repeat these decreases every 2nd R another 2 times, then

every R until there are 10 (12) 10 (12) 10 sts left. Graft together (sts from top with sts from the sole).

NOTE! Alternatively work another decrease round, cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining 6 (8) 6 (8) 6 sts. Work another sock in the same way.



COLLAR

Cast on 104 (116) 128 sts on 3 mm needles. K 1 R (= WS). Work pattern according to diagram then, after the diagram, work stocking st inside 1 edge st on each side (explained in diagram), until the collar measures approx. 2.5 (2.5) 3 cm. Finish with a WS R.


On the next R *K2 tog*, repeat from *-* to end of R = 52 (58) 64 sts.

K 1 R and then an eyelet R as follows: 1 edge st, *1 Y/O, K2 tog*, repeat from *–* to end of R.

Work 1 R then cast off with K sts.

Crochet from the RS along the sides and cast-on edge as follows: *1 ss through 1 st/R, 3 ch sts, skip 2sts/R*, repeat from *_*.

Sew on a button at the top of one short edge of the collar. Use the ch space on the opposite side as a buttonhole.



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
