YARN

SOFT MERINO 100 % extra fine merino wool, 50 grams = approx. 187 metres

SIZES

0 (3) 6 (12) 24 months

NOTE! See GARMENT MEASUREMENTS to find the right size

GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

Chest measurements approx. 51 (56) 61 (66) cm Full length approx. 27 (30) 34 (38) cm Sleeve length approx. 16 (18) 20 (24) cm

YARN AMOUNTS

4 (4) 5 (6) balls

COLOURS

Sand 3006

SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZES

2.5 and 3 mm long and short circular needles and DPNs

ACCESSORIES

4 buttons

KNITTING TENSION

28 sts pattern according to diagram with needle size 3 mm = 10 cm

Alternative yarn: BABY ULL

Check your knitting tension by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm; if you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts, change to a smaller needle size.

FIND THE RIGHT SIZE

- 1. Measure a garment that fits you.
- 2. Compare the measurements with the pattern.
- 3. Choose your size from the chest measurements.
- 4. Body and sleeves can be worked longer or shorter as needed.

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit, P = purl, st. = stitch, r = row, DPN = double pointed needles, <math>m1r = make one right, m1l = make one left



Garter st = K all rows.

FRONT AND BACK PIECES

Cast on 169 (187) 201 (219) sts with circular needle size 3 mm. Row 1 = wrong side.) Work back and forth as follows: Work 3 sts **garter st**, pattern according to diagram until there are 3 sts left, 3 sts **garter st**.

Insert a marker in each side, with 49 (54) 58 (63) sts on each front piece and 71 (79) 85 (93) sts on the back piece. When the piece measures 17 (19) 22 (25) cm and the next row is from the wrong side, work 2 buttonholes, **at the same time** as you cast off for the armholes:

Boys: Work 3 sts, cast off 2 sts, work 16 (18) 20 (22) sts, cast off 2 sts, work to 5 sts before the first side-marker, cast off 10 sts, work 61 (69) 75 (83) sts, cast off 10 sts, work to end of

Girls: Work to 5 sts before the first side-marker, cast off 10 sts, work to 5 sts before the second side-marker, cast off 10 sts, work until there are 23 (25) 27 (29) sts left, cast off 2 sts, work 16 (18) 20 (22) sts, cast off 2 sts, work to end of row. Lay the piece to one side and work the sleeves.

SLEEVES

Cast on 43 (47) 51 (55) sts with circular needle size 3 mm. (Row 1 = wrong side). Work pattern according to diagram, back and forth, and increase 1 st on each side every 2 (2.5) 2.5 (2.5) cm, 6 (6) 7 (8) times = 55 (59) 65 (71) sts. Increase by lifting the strand between the 2 outermost sts and knitting it twisted. Work until the piece measures approx. 16 (18) 20 (24) cm. Finish with the same row in the diagram as on the body, at the same time cast off 5 sts on each side for the armholes = 45 (49) 55 (61) sts. Lay the piece to one side and work the other sleeve.

YOKE

Place left front piece, left sleeve, back piece, right sleeve and right front piece on circular needle size 3 mm. Continue with pattern and garter st as before, at the same time on row 1, cast on 2 new sts over the buttonholes = 239 (265) 291 (321) sts. Insert a marker in each transition = 4 markers. On row 3 (= right side) decrease as follows for raglan by each marker: Work to 2 sts before the marker, K2 together, slip 1 st, K1, pass slipped st over = 8 sts decreased. On the wrong side P the 2 raglan-sts. K from the right side, when not decreasing. Repeat this decrease every 4th row, 4 (5) 7 (8) more times, then every 2nd row 8 (9) 9 (10) times = 135 (145) 155 (169) sts. At the same time, when you have decreased 11 (13) 15 (17) times, work a buttonhole as before. Cast off for the neck on each side (on row 1 after the above raglan-decreases are finished) 15 (17) 19 (21) sts 1 time, then every 2nd row, 2,2,1,1 sts at the same time as you continue to decrease for raglan every 2nd row 4 more times = 61 (67) 73 (83) sts. Leave the stitches on the needle.


HOOD


Adjust st-number to 62 (68) 74 (84) sts. Change to needle size 2.5 mm and work 2 (2) 2 (2.5) cm rib, with K1, P1. Finish after a row from the right side. Insert a marker round 2 sts in the middle of the row = mid-sts. These sts are always worked in stocking st. Change to 3 mm needles. Work pattern according to diagram **E**, at the same time on row 1, increase 4 (5) 6 (7) sts evenly on each side of mid-sts = 70 (78) 86 (98) sts. Continue like this with 2 stocking sts and pattern on each side of these, at the same time increase 1 st on each side of the mid-sts, every 10th row 7 (7) 8 (8) times = 84 (92) 102 (114) sts. Work until the hood measures 18 (20) 22 (24) cm. Divide the sts on 2 needles, with 42 (46) 51 (57) sts on each. Turn wrong side out. K together 1 st from each needle, at the same time as you cast off. Knit up approx. 14 sts per 5 cm, with needle size 2.5 mm, along edge of hood. Work 2 cm rib with K1, P1. Cast off with K and P. Sew end-edges to front pieces.

ASSEMBLY

Sew the sleeve seams. Sew together under the sleeves. Sew buttonhole stitch around buttonholes if you wish Sew on the buttons.







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
