YARN

LERKE 53 % merino wool, 47 % Egyptian cotton,
50 grams = approx. 115 metres

Alternative yarn: MERINO 22, ØKO BOMULL,
NATURAL LANOLIN WOOL

SIZES

2 (4) 6 (8) 10 (12) years

NOTE! See MEASUREMENTS to determine the right size

MEASUREMENTS

Upper body approx. 61 (64) 68 (74) 78 (83) cm

Full length approx. 30 (34) 38 (42) 46 (50) cm

Sleeves approx. 24 (27) 33 (36) 38 (40) cm

YARN REQUIREMENTS

5 (6) 7 (9) 11 (13) balls

COLOUR

Old Pink 8123

NOTE! We've updated the colours used in this pattern as the original colourways have been discontinued. The colours may therefore differ slightly from those shown in the picture.

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

3.5 mm and 4 mm short and long circular needles and DPNs

ACCESSORIES

6–8 buttons

GAUGE

23 sts Fisherman's rib on 4 mm needles = approx. 10 cm

NOTE! When counting sts, 1 st + 1 Y/O count as 1 st

Check your gauge by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm. If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

FIND THE RIGHT SIZE

1. Measure a garment that fits.
2. Compare your measurements with those in the pattern.
3. Select a size based on the upper body measurements.
4. Body and sleeves may be worked longer or shorter as desired.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit, p = purl, st = stitch, R = round/row,
DPN = double pointed needles, Y/O = yarn over,
K2tog = knit 2 together, m = marker, PM = place marker,
tbl = through back loop, m1l = make one left,
m1r = make one right, RS/WS = right/wrong side

Edge sts are always knitted.

Fisherman's rib, worked flat

R1: (= WS) K1 (edge st), *K1, 1 Y/O, slip 1 st P-wise*, repeat from *-* and finish with K1, 1 edge st.

R2: K1 (edge st), *P1, K 1 + Y/O tog*, repeat from *-* and finish with P1, 1 edge st.

Repeat R 1–2.

Fisherman's rib in the round

R 1: *Y/O, slip 1 st P-wise, P1*, repeat from *-*.

R 2: *K Y/O + 1 st tog, P1*, repeat from *-*.

Repeat rounds 1–2.

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FRONT AND BACK PIECES

Cast on 149 (157) 165 (177) 189 (201) sts on 3.5 mm circular needles. Work rib flat as follows:

R 1: (WS) K 1 (edge st), *P1, K1*, repeat from *-* , finish with P1, 1 edge-st.

R2: K 1 (edge st), *K1, P1*, repeat from *-* , finish with K1, 1 edge-st.

Repeat R 1–2.

When the ribbing measures approx. 1 cm and the next R is RS, work one buttonhole as follows: K1 (edge st), K1, K2tog, 2 Y/Os, K2tog tbl, P1, work to end of row. On next R work the Y/Os into the rib. Work until ribbing measures approx. 5 (5) 6 (6) 7 (7) cm, finishing with a RS R.

Place the outer 7 sts on each side on st holders for the front edges. PM around 1 st in each side (= m sts) with 32 (34) 36 (39) 42 (45) sts for each front piece and 69 (73) 77 (83) 89 (95) sts for the back piece. Change to 4 mm circular needles. Cast on 1 st in each side = edge sts.

Work **Fisherman's rib flat**.

Work until the piece measures approx. 18 (21) 24 (27) 30 (33) cm and the last R was from the WS. **At the same time**, on the last R, cast off 7 (7) 7 (9) 9 (9) sts on each side for armholes (= m sts + 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) sts on each side) = 30 (32) 34 (36) 39 (42) sts for each front piece and 63 (67) 71 (75) 81 (87) for the back piece.

Put aside and work the sleeves.

SLEEVES

Cast on 38 (40) 42 (44) 46 (48) sts on 3.5 mm DPNs.

Work 6 (6) 7 (7) 8 (8) cm rib in the round (K1, P1).

Change to 4 mm needles. K across 1 R, **while at the same time** increasing 32 (34) 38 (42) 44 (46) sts evenly spaced = 70 (74) 80 (86) 90 (94) sts. Increase by lifting the strand between 2 sts and K tbl. PM around the last st on R.

Work **Fisherman's rib in the round**.

When the piece measures 10 (10) 11 (11) 12 (12) cm, decrease 1 st on each side of m st. Repeat the decrease every 1.5 (2) 2.5 (2.5) 2.5 (3) cm 7 (7) 7 (8) 8 (8) times in total = 56 (60) 66 (70) 74 (78) sts. Work until the sleeve measures approx. 24 (27) 33 (36) 38 (40) cm.

Finish on the same round as on the body. **At the same time**, on the last R cast off 7 (7) 7 (9) 9 (9) sts under the sleeve (= m sts + 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) sts on each side) = 49 (53) 59 (61) 65 (69) sts. Work the other sleeve in the same way.

YOKE

Place the right front piece, right sleeve, back piece, left sleeve and left front piece onto the same 4 mm circular needles = 221 (237) 257 (269) 289 (309) sts.

PM around 6 sts in each transition (= 3 sts from each piece) = m sts. Work 1 R of **Fisherman's rib** from RS, **while at the same time** working each transition as follows: K1, P1, K2tog, P1, K1 (= 5 m sts in each transition) = 217 (233) 253 (265) 285 (305) sts.

Continue working **Fisherman's rib** and work the m sts as follows:

RS: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1.

WS: P1, K1, P1, K1, P1.

At the same time, on R 3, decrease for raglan by working until 2 sts before the m sts. P2tog, work m sts, P2tog after m sts = decreased 8 sts. **NOTE!** When counting sts, 1 st + 1 Y/O count as 1 st.

Repeat the raglan decreases alternately on every 2nd and 4th R, 13 (14) 15 (16) 18 (19) times in total = 113 (121) 133 (137) 141 (153) sts. Place 4 (4) 5 (5) 6 (6) sts on each side on a st holder for the neckline. Continue working raglan decreases as before, **while at the same time** casting off for neckline at the beginning of each R 2 (2,2) 2,2 (2,2) 2,2 (2,2) sts in each side, then 1 st until the raglan decreases meet the neckline.

LEFT FRONT EDGE

Place the 7 front edge sts from the st holder onto 3.5 mm needles. Cast on 1 st in each side towards the front piece = edge sts. Work rib with 1 edge st on each side until the front edge reaches the neckline when stretched well. Cast off edge st towards the front piece = 8 sts. Place sts on a st holder. Place markers for 5–7 buttons along the edge.

NOTE! The last button is on the neck.

RIGHT FRONT EDGE

Work in same way as left edge, working buttonholes corresponding to the button markers.

NECKLINE

Place sts from front and back pieces onto 3.5 mm circular needles. Pick up approx. 4 sts per 2 cm along the neckline and work in the sts from the front edges. The st count must be divisible by 2+1. Work rib with K1, P1 as on the front edges. When the neck measures 1 cm, work the last buttonhole. When the neck measures approx. 2 (2) 2 (2) 2.5 (2.5) cm, cast off 7 sts on each side. Work until the neck measures 4 (4) 4 (4) 5 (5) cm. Cast off with K and P sts.

POCKETS

Begin approx. 3 (3.5) 4 (4.5) 5 (5.5) cm from the edge st on the right hand side. Use 4 mm needles. Pick up 1 st through each st in the transition between rib and Fisherman's rib until you have a total of 19 (19) 21 (21) 23 (23) sts.

Work rib with K1, P1 for 7 (7.5) 8 (8.5) 9 (9.5) cm. Cast off with K and P sts.

Work one more pocket in the same way on the left front piece.

ASSEMBLY

Join underarm seams. Fold the neck double to the inside and sew down. Attach pockets to front pieces. Sew on the buttons.
