## DESIGN

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## YARN

LILLE LERKE 53 \% merino wool, 47 \% Egyptian cotton, 50 grams = approx. 142 metres
TYNN KIDSILK ERLE 53 \% mohair, 34 \% silk, 13 \% wool, 25 grams = approx. 287.5 metres
PUS 70 \% baby alpaca, 17 \% acrylic, 13 \% polyamide,
50 grams = approx. 100 metres

## SIZES

2 (4) 6 (8) 10 (12) years
NOTE! See MEASUREMENTS to find the right size

## MEASUREMENTS

Upper body approx. 62 (67) 72 (76) 81 (87) cm
Full length approx. 36 (40) 44 (48) 52 (56) cm
Sleeves approx. 26 (29) 32 (35) 38 (41) cm

## SUGGESTED NEEDLES

$2.5 \mathrm{~mm}, 3 \mathrm{~mm}$, and 6 mm short and long circular needles and DPNs

GAUGE
26 sts stocking st with LILLE LERKE on 3 mm needles $=10 \mathrm{~cm}$

Check your gauge by working a swatch.
Count the number of sts per 10 cm . If you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts change to a smaller needle size.

## FIND THE RIGHT SIZE

1. Measure a knitted garment that fits.
2. Compare your measurements with those in the pattern.
3. Select a size based on the upper body measurements.
4. Body and sleeves may be worked longer or shorter as desired.

## ABBREVIATIONS

$\mathrm{k}=$ knit, $\mathrm{p}=$ purl, st $=$ stitch, $\mathrm{R}=$ round/row, DPN $=$ double pointed needles, $k 2 \mathrm{tog}=$ knit 2 together $\mathrm{m}=$ marker, $\mathrm{PM}=$ place marker, $\mathrm{Y} / \mathrm{O}=$ yarn over, tbl = through back loop, RS/WS = right/wrong side


For the skirt pattern, see DG 454-03

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NOTE! Colour 1 TYNN KIDSILK ERLE is held double whenever used.

## BODY

Cast on 162 (174) 186 (198) 210 (226) sts with 2 strands of colour 1 on 2.5 mm circular needles. Work in the around according to diagram $\mathbf{A}$. Change to 3 mm needles and work pattern according to diagrams $\mathbf{B}$ and $\mathbf{C}$. Onwards, you will work diagrams $\mathbf{A}, \mathbf{B}$, and $\mathbf{C}$ alternately throughout. PM in each side with 81 (87) 93 (99) 105 (113) sts for both the front and back pieces. Work until the piece measures approx. $22(25) 28$ (31) 34 (35) cm. Divide the piece at each $m$ and finish the front and back pieces separately.

## BACK PIECE

= 81 (87) 93 (99) 105 (113) sts.
Work flat in pattern as before. Cast off for armholes at the beginning of each R: 2,1,1 (2,1,1,1) 2,2,1,1 (3,2,1,1) 3,2,2,1 $(3,3,2,1)$ sts on each side $=73(77) 81(85) 89(95)$ sts. When the piece measures approx. 34 (38) 42 (46) 50 (54) cm, work diagonal shoulder decreases at the beginning of each R: $7,7,7(8,7,7) 8,8,7(8,8,8) 9,8,8(9,9,9)$ sts on each side $=$ 31 (33) 35 (37) 39 (41) sts. Place sts on a st holder.

## FRONT PIECE

= 81 (87) 93 (99) 105 (113) sts
Work in the same way as the back piece. When the piece measures 30 (34) 38 (42) 46 (50) cm, cast off the middle 21 (23) 25 (27) 29 (31) sts for the neckline. Finish each side separately and cast off for the neckline every 2 nd $\mathrm{R}: 2,2,1$ sts. When the piece measures approx. 34 (38) 42 (46) 50 (54) cm, work diagonal shoulder in the same way as on the back piece. Work the other side in the same way but in reverse.

## SLEEVES

Cast on 34 (36) 38 (40) 42 (44) sts with colour 1 held double on 2.5 mm DPNs. Work pattern in the round according to diagram A. Change to 3 mm needles and work stocking st with colour 1. At the same time, increase 26 (28) 28 (30) 32 (34) sts evenly spaced on R1 $=60$ (64) 66 (70) 74 (78) sts and 24 (26) 27 (29) 31 (33) sts evenly spaced on R3 = 84 (90) 93 (99) 105 (111) sts. PM around the first and last sts = (under the sleeve). Change to 6 mm needles and colour 5. *K1, K2tog*. Repeat from *-* to end of round. NOTE! It may be a bit tricky working 6 mm needles through the sts; if so, use a 3 mm needle to work a very loose st and place it on the 6 mm needle. Work pattern according to diagram D. Change to 3 mm needles and colour 1 held double. *K1, K2 through
next st*. Repeat from *-* to end of round. Work pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{E}$. Change to 6 mm needles and colour 5. *K1, K2tog*. Repeat from *-* to end of round. Work pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{D}$. Change to 3 mm needles and colour 1 held double. *K1, K2 through next st*. Repeat from *-* to end of round. Finish the piece, working pattern according to diagram $\mathbf{E}$. Work until the piece measures approx. 26 (29) 32 (35) 38 (41) cm, or desired length. Cast off 10 sts under the sleeve ( $=5$ sts on each side of marker) $=74(80) 83$ (89) 95 (101) sts. Cast off for the sleeve cap at the beginning of each $R, 5,4,3,2,2,2,1,1,1,1$ sts $=30$ (36) 39 (45) 51 (57) sts. Change to colour 1 held double and work 1 $R$ without decreasing, then cast off remaining sts. Work one more sleeve.

ASSEMBLY
Join the shoulder seams. Baste a strand of yarn through the top of the sleeve. Use it to pull the sleeve tighter so its width matches the armhole. Sew in the sleeves. Make sure middle of sleeve matches the shoulder seam.

## NECKLINE

Place the neck sts on 2.5 mm short circular needles. Using colour 3, pick up 53 (55) 57 (59) 59 (61) sts evenly spaced along the neckline $=84$ (88) 92 (96) 98 (102) sts. Work the final $7 R$ according to diagram $\mathbf{A}$, in the round. Cast off loosely.


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
