PINK BOW POTHOLDERS

DESIGN

House of Yarn

YARN

OLDER 100 % wool, 50 grams = approx. 95 metres

SIZE AFTER FELTING

Approx. 18 x 18 cm

YARN AMOUNTS

2 balls for two potholders

COLOUR

Pink 418

SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZE

5.5 mm long circular needles 5 mm crochet hook

ACCESSORIES (optional)

Approx. 10 cm pink silk ribbon, 3 mm, for the bows

KNITTING TENSION BEFORE FELTING

16 sts in garter st on 5.5 mm needles = 10 cm

Check your knitting tension by working a swatch.

Count the number of sts per 10 cm; if you have more sts than suggested, change to a larger needle size. If you have fewer sts, change to a smaller needle size.

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit, P = purl, st. = stitch, y/o = yarn over, DPN = double pointed needles

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Cast on 77 sts on 5.5 mm needles and work back and forth as follows:

(row 1 = wrong side)

Row 1: K. Place a marker around the middle st (= marker-st). **Row 2:** K to 1 st before the marker-st, slip 1 st, K2 together, pass the slipped st over, K to end of row = 2 sts decreased. Repeat rows 1-2 until there are 3 sts left. K3 together = 1 st. Place this st onto a 5 mm crochet hook.

LOOP

Work 24 chs. Work 1 ss in the last cast-off st, then 1 ss in each ch around the loop.

Cut the yarn and pull it through the remaining st.

ASSEMBLY

Felt the piece in the washing machine; use a delicate programme and a wool detergent. If the felting is not sufficient, you can re-felt or felt in the tumble dryer.

NOTE! Washing machines vary; try felting a swatch before felting the potholder.

Shape the piece before drying. Tie the silk ribbon into a small bow and sew onto the potholder (see picture).
