
Sew it yourself: Scarf




Materials

 Fabric approx. 30 x 130 cm (we recommend woven viscose, light cotton, muslin or similar)


- 1. Assemble the pattern at the red lines.
- 2. Cut 2 pieces of fabric according to the pattern
- 3. Sew the two pieces of fabric together with a 1 cm seam allowance. Leave a piece of approx. 8 cm left open, to turn through.
- 4. Cut the seam allowance to approx. 2 mm at the two pointed ends.
- 5. Turn right side out and pull the scarf into shape. Press the edges if necessary.
- 6. Sew a decorative stitch all the way around the edge. This closes the hole at the same time.



Assemble the pattern like this



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
