## **SMALL CHICKENS**





## **MATERIALS**


- Fabric remnants
- · Beads for eyes
- Felt
- Fibre filling
- Plastic granulate


## **CUT**


- 1 piece of fabric for the body measuring 7.5 cm x 15 cm
- 1 piece of fabric for the beak and 1 piece for the comb in orange felt


## **STITCH**




Fig. 1

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

- 1. Place comb and beak approx. 1 cm from one corner, fold fabric in half and stitch together with 0.5 seam. See fig. 1.
- 2. Fold body into a pyramid shape and stitch base together, stitch seam to fit across centre, leaving one 3 cm gap open for turning through. See fig. 2.
- 3. Turn right side out, stuff fibre filling in chicken, stuff a little plastic granulate in the 2 bottom corners, stitch hole closed with small invisible stitches.
- 4. Stitch beads on for eyes.
