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ABBREVIATIONS:**st(s)** = stitch(es)**k** = knit**p** = purl**patt** = pattern**ed st** = edge st**st st** = stocking stitch**inc** = increase(s)**dec** = decrease(s)**cont** = continue**rep** = repeat**rem** = remain**RS** = right side**WS** = wrong side**PATTERN:**

Number of sts divisible by 8 + 2 sts + 2 ed st.

Row 1: *k2, p6* rep from * to * and end with k2.**Row 2:** P2, *k6, p2* rep from * to *.**Row 3:** K.**Row 4:** K2, *k2, p2, k4* rep from * to *.**Row 5:** *p4, k2, p2* rep from * to *.**Row 6:** P.**BACK:**

On UK size 9 [3,5 mm] needles cast on 108 [116] 124 [132] 140 sts and work in rib, divide the sts as follows: 1 ed st, *k2, p2* rep from * to * and end with k2, 1 ed st. When the rib edge measures 6 cm switch to UK size 8 [4 mm] needles and cont working in patt between the ed sts as described above.

Work even in patt until the work measures 47 cm and cast off for armhole on both sides for 4-3-2-1-1-1 sts = 84 [92] 100 [108] 116 sts.

Work even until the armhole measures 21 [22] 23 [24] 25 cm. Now cast off for shoulder and neck at the same time: Cast off for the shoulder on every 2nd row for 6-6-6-6 sts [6-6-7-7 sts] 7-7-7-7 sts [7-7-8-8 sts] 8-8-8-8 sts. At the same time place the middle 30 [34] 38 [42] 46 sts on a st holder for the neckband and finish each side separately. Cast off on the neck side on every 2nd row for an additional 2-1 sts.

FRONT:

Worked in the same way as the front but with a deeper neck opening.

When the armhole measures 16 [17] 18 [19] 20 cm place the middle 10 [14] 18 [22] 26 sts on a st holder and finish each side separately. Cast off for neck on every 2nd row for an additional 4-3-2-1-1-1-1 sts. Cast off the shoulder st from the armhole side at the same height and in the same way as on the back.

Merry Fraya

100 % Merino Wool

YARDAGE

850 [900] 950 [1000] 1050 g

GAUGE

22,5 sts and 33 rows to 10 x 10 cm
in patt on size 4 mm needles.

SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZE

UK size 9 and 8 (3½ and 4 mm), UK size
9(3½ mm) double pointed needles, st
holders

Please note: The needle sizes given above are only suggestions. The size of the needles you need depends on your personal gauge. If you knit firmly you might need a large needle size, if you knit loosely you might need a smaller needle size.

SLEEVES:

On the UK size 9 [3,5 mm] needles cast on 52 [52] 52 [60] 60 sts and work 6 cm of rib, divide the sts as on the back and front. Switch to UK size 8 [4 mm] needles and cont in patt between the ed sts as described above. Inc 1 st on each side on every 8th row a total of 18 times = 88 [88] 88 [96] 96 sts.

When the sleeve measures 51 cm cast off for the arm hole on both sides on every 2nd row for 4 sts once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once and 1 st 20 [20] 20 [24] 24 times, 2 sts twice, 3 sts twice. Cast off the rem 10 sts. Knit another identical sleeve.

Sew the shoulder seam.

NECKBAND:

Using the UK size 9 [3,5 mm] double pointed needles or circular needles k the resting 30 [34] 38 [42] 46 sts of the back, pick up 26 sts from here until the sts of the front, k the resting 10 [14] 18 [22] 26 sts of the front and pick up 26 sts from here until the beginning of the sts of the back = 92 [100] 108 [116] 124 sts. Work in rib [k2, p2]. When the neckband measures 4 cm cast off all sts in rib.

FINISHING:

Weave in the ends, sew on the sleeves and sew the side seams and sleeve seams.
