# Sloppy blanket



■ WHEN THE EVENINGS TURN COOLER, THE SLOPPY BLANKET COMES TO THE RESCUE. THE LOVELY BLANKET IS WORKED IN A LACE PATTERN – AND THE ELONGATED STITCHES MEAN THAT IT IS A QUICKER KNIT THAN YOU WOULD THINK. THE PERFECT PROJECT FOR THE ADVANCED BEGINNER OR INTERMEDIATE KNITTER – BRING ON THE COOLER WEATHER!

## **ABBREVIATIONS:**

st(s) = stitch(es)
k = knit

**k2tog** = knit 2 stitches together

**kfb** = Work an increase by knitting first into

the front and then the back of the

same stitch = purl

**p2tog** = purl 2 stitches together

RS = right side WS = wrong side tbl = through the back loop(s)

tog = together

Selv

= Selvedge stitch: Slip the first stitch of row purl-wise with the yarn held in front (without knitting it). Knit the last

stitch of the row.

### **PATTERN**

Cast on 110 sts on a UK size 2 (7 mm) needle. Work 5 rows in stockinette stitch, beginning with a WS row, remembering to work the first and last stitch of every row as selv.

Now work in pattern as follows:

**Row 6 (RS):** 1 selv, \*yarn over, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, k1. There are now 218 sts on the needle.

Row 7 (vrang): 1 selv, purl to the last stitch, k1. There are now 218 sts on the needle.

**Row 8:** 1 selv, \*k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv. There are now 110 sts on the needle.

**Row 9:** 1 selv, \*yarn over,  $k2tog^*$ , repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

Row 10: Knit to end of row.

Row 11: Purl to end of row.

Row 12: Knit to end of row.

Row 13: Purl to end of row.

Row 14: 1 selv, \*yarn over twice, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

**Row 15:** 1 selv, \*purl stitch and let the yarn overs fall off the needle\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

Row 16: Knit to end of row.

Row 17: Purl to end of row.

Row 18: 1 selv, \*p2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

Row 19: 1 selv, \*kfb\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

Row 20: 1 selv, \* yarn over twice, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

**Row 21:** 1 selv, \* purl stitch and let the yarn overs fall off the needle\*, repeat from \* to \* to the last stitch, 1 selv.

Row 22: Knit to end of row.

Row 23: Purl to end of row.

Row 24: Knit to end of row.

Row 25: Purl to end of row.

Rows 6 – 25 forms the pattern. Repeat the pattern until the work measures approx. 140 cm.

End by working 4 rows in stockinette stitch. Bind off.

Weave in all ends and gently press according to the directions on the yarn label.

Tassels: Cut approx. 25 cm length of yarn. Group them together, so there are 3-4 in each tassel and tie them to each end of the blanket.

Optionally you can experiment with adding different yarns that you might have left over.

## MEASUREMENTS

100 cm x 140 cm

#### YARN

Happy Fraya 44% Baby Alpaca + 32% Fine Merino + 22% Polyamid + 2% Viscose 50 q = 110 m

## YARDAGE

400 g

## GAUGE

In stockinette stitch: 11 sts x 15 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm on UK size 2 (7 mm) needles.

## SUGGESTED NEEDLE SIZE

UK size 2 (7 mm) circular needle, 80 cm

Please note: The needle sizes given above are only suggestions. The size of the needles you need depends on your personal gauge. If you knit firmly you might need a large needle size, if you knit loosely you might need a smaller needle size.
